Governor announces partial reopening of some outdoor recreation activities

Gov. Jay Inslee announced on Monday afternoon the partial reopening of outdoor recreation activities is planned for May 5 and includes fishing, hunting and golf.

Starting next week, day use of state parks, public lands, fish and wildlife areas will be allowed as long as proper social distancing is practiced. Inslee said that if people are experiencing coronavirus symptoms, they should still stay home.

"This is not a return to normal today," Inslee said. "The virus is too rampant to allow that."

When golfing, people can only play with one person from outside their household, but four can play if from the same household.

CDC adds six new symptoms as signs of coronavirus

The Centers for Disease Control & Prevention has updated its list of coronavirus symptoms to include: fever, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, new loss of taste or smell. A runny nose rarely occurs with COVID-19, and sneezing is still not a symptom of the virus.

"People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported — ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness," reads the [CDC's website](#). Any of the now nine symptoms may appear anywhere from 2-14 days after exposure to the virus, according to the agency.

The CDC recommends that people seek medical attention immediately if they develop any of these emergency warning signs:

- Trouble breathing
- Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
- New confusion or inability to arouse
- Bluish lips or face
